TEAMS RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION IN SCIENCE COMPETITION

Fourth and fifth grade student teams each received honorable mention recognition for their entries in the 2018-2019 Toshiba/NSTA (National Science Teacher Association) ExploraVision science and technology competition. This recognition places the teams in the top 10% of the entries submitted across the nation and the only 4th and 5th grade teams from Pennsylvania to be receive this acknowledgement.

The fourth grader's entry, the SSS Drone, focused on a way to improve school safety by using drone technology to scan the perimeter around schools. The fifth grader's entry, the Genius Protection System, focused on using GPS sili- cone tracking stickers to enhance child safety.

The ExploraVision contest challenges students to envision and communicate how technology will evolve to solve problems 20 years in the future. Students research a current technology, imagine how it might change to solve a problem, and explain the breakthroughs that would need to happen over the next two decades to make their idea possible.
