
Dear Selinsgrove Area School District,

The foundation's mission is to augment that spirit through *The Survivor's Benefit* when tragedy strikes.

The Survivor's Benefit has been established to help ensure that the financial burdens can be lessened during a devastating time of need by providing financial support to a race car driver's family in the event of their death while in competition at a track in Central Pennsylvania.

Greg Hodnett was a professional sprint car driver that lost his life in a sprint car crash at a Pennsylvania race track on September 20, 2018.

Born Hoyt Gregory Hodnett in Memphis, TN, on June 18, 1969, Greg became one of the nations premiere sprint car racers, amassing over 250 wins during his illustrious career.

Before becoming one of the best to ever drive a sprint car, Greg graduated with honors from Memphis State University, earning his Bachelors Degree in Mechanical Engineering.

Greg's path in life took him on the road full time with the World of Outlaws, where he won Rookie of the Year Honors in 1993. After several seasons on tour, Greg's career took a turn and found him becoming a member of the Pennsylvania Posse, where he competed for 19 seasons before his untimely death.

Greg quickly became one of the winningest and most popular drivers in Pennsylvania, as he racked up wins and championships driving for five of the top teams in the history of Pennsylvania sprint car racing.

Greg's Pennsylvania career began in the Bob Stewart owned Apple Motorsports #12 before moving into the Al Hamilton Motorsports #77 sprint car. Following two years in that car, Greg joined forces with Jim and Sandy Kline and drove their familiar #22 for four seasons winning his biggest career race-the Williams Grove Speedway National Open in 2009. Greg then drove for John Trone and the Trone Outdoor Motorsports #39 team for several years before landing a ride with Michael Heffner's - Heffner Racing Enterprises #27 where he was in his fifth season before his death. Greg's final win with Heffner came in a preliminary night of the Knoxville Nationals, which ranked up there along with his National Open win.

In just 19 years of competition, Greg sits near the top of every win list at nearly all of Central PA's sprint car tracks.
